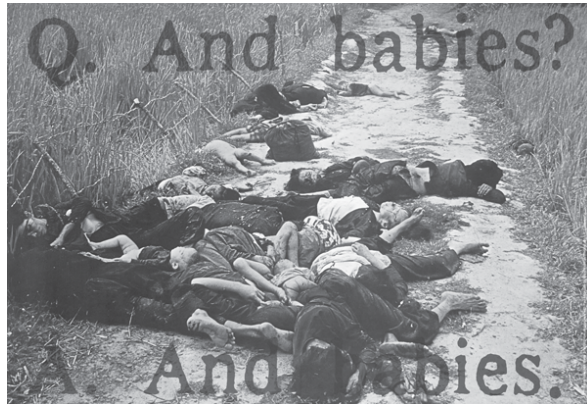


## Timeline: Art Strikes & Protests in New York (GAAG & AWC) 1969-1971

10/10/1969	Malevich Action at the MoMa
01/03/1970	Memorial Service for Dead Babies at the MoMa
03/02/1970	Meeting of AWC with John Hightower, Director of the MoMa. GAAG members in the audience raise questions.
03/28/1970	Pro-abortion women's march, Women Artists in Revolution (W.A.R) and Ad Hc Women Artists and GAAG- Poppy Johnson had made aprons that people wore saying 'This foetus the property of NY State?'
04/28/1970	Press conference at Judson Memorial Church demanding release of Herman Claeys. Gaag supported the action.
05/22/1970	Art Strike against Racism, Sexism, Repression & War demo on MET museum steps
06/18/1970	Art Strike against Racism, Sexism, Repression & War demo at the MoMa
11/03/1970	GAAG and Belgium Government in Exile Preliminary action to flag burning
11/09/1970	Flag show at the Judson Memorial Church on Washington Square Park
12/01/1970	Flag burning ceremony: Judson 3 and their supporters after the first trial hearing in the criminal court
12/29/1970	Petition in MoMa for changing the flag law
05/01/1971	AWC protest at Guggenheim museum re: censorship of the Haacke exhibition by the director Thomas M Messer
08/30/1971	PASTA MoMa Strike outside the MoMa
09/23/1971	AWC demo in front of the museum of modern art against Nelson Rockefeller the Butcher of ATTICA
11/19/1971	GAAG Attica Action at the Avant-garde festival in Armory
